JANE HECKER – President (2 year term)

PUBLIC POLICY MATTERS - More About Petition Drives in Michigan

At the most recent monthly Zoom meeting chaired by AAUW MI Government Relations Coordinator, Mary Pollock, attendees were treated to presentations by key people in the movements supporting the petitions listed below. We were strongly urged to not only sign the petitions, but to get copies and gather signatures to support them, even if it is within our small circle of friends and family.

AAUWMI Supports – How to Get Involved

Michigan Minimum Wage Increase to \$15 – raise the minimum wage to \$15/hour by 2027, including tipped workers. Chantel Watkins, an organizer for One Fair Wage Michigan made an impassioned plea for assistance with their petition. That can be found at <http://raisethewagemi.org/>. Did you know that over 70% of tipped workers are women? This action includes a cost-of-living component.

Promote the Vote 2022 – proposal would insert language in the State Constitution that would create a right to vote without intimidation or harassment; allow absentee ballots from military and overseas voters to be counted six days after election if they are postmarked by Election Day; require proof of identity to vote, but a signature would be sufficient for absentee voters. Kim Murphy-Kovalick told us that Promote the Vote 2022 is a coalition of organizations and individuals committed to ensuring Michigan has a voting system that works for all of us. Get the petition at <https://promotethevote2022.com/>.

Reproductive Freedom for All – would create a right protecting all aspects of reproduction including abortion but allow the state to regulate, including banning abortion after fetal viability except if necessary to protect the life or health of the pregnant woman, the Roe v. Wade standard. Jessica Ayoub spoke eloquently about this topic, where we are leading the way to have this enshrined in the Michigan state constitution. 425,059 signatures are required for this to be put on the ballot. There are 2.2 million women of childbearing age in this state of a population of 10 million. Their petition can be found at www.mobiliz.us/mireproductivefreedom/event/449626. A list of partners is also available on the site.

AND NATIONALLY... Support the Raise the Wage Act

Raising the minimum wage is an important part of ensuring women's economic security and that of their families. Women make up nearly two-thirds of minimum-wage workers nationwide, and women of color are over-represented among essential workers who are on the front lines in the fight against COVID-19. Thus, they are particularly harmed by the \$7.25 federal minimum wage that has not gone up in more than a decade and by the \$2.13 tipped minimum cash wage that has been frozen for an astonishing 28 years. Raising these low minimum wages would also help to shrink the persistent gender pay gap. The Raise the Wage Act (H.R 603/S. 53) would gradually increase the federal minimum wage from \$7.25 to \$15 per hour by 2025, then index the minimum wage so that it continues to rise along with wages overall. It will also end unfair exclusions for tipped workers, people with disabilities, and youth so that they, too, can benefit from a decent minimum wage.

Voters have made it clear they support increasing the minimum wage, with 29 states and Washington, D.C. enacting measures to raise their state's minimum wage above the federal level. But this patchwork of laws doesn't ensure that every worker can make a fair wage. We need federal action now.


