
FORWARD INTO THE NEW YEAR

- ♥ She will be joining us at our luncheon meeting March 14 to bring us up to date on what is happening in the state. Please plan to attend this important meeting.



GREAT DECISIONS EXCITING NEWS

At our next meeting on February, the 21st, we will be discussing **Laboratories of Autocracy: A Wake-Up Call from Behind the Lines** by David Pepper. He is also the author of four novels which combine real world politics and fiction with each other and **A Simple Choice** which was published this year.





His B.A. and law degree are both from Yale. He clerked for a judge on the U.S. Court of Appeals, served in local elected office in Ohio, worked for major law firms and teaches election and voter rights law. The Wall Street Journal described Pepper "as one of the best political-thriller writers on the scene." Another reviewer refers to *Laboratories of Autocracy* as a "very readable book that is at times astonishing and at other times sobering. It was hard to put

down."

Pepper appeared in the documentary "All in," which highlights Stacey Abrams' nationwide fight for voting rights, and additionally writes for a variety of newspapers and magazines.
