Getting Involved in Preventing Gun Violence

I feel it necessary, given the latest mass shootings at MSU, to address another very important issue for us all. As I write this, there have been more mass shootings in the US in 2023 than we have had days in 2023. As stated in AAUW's latest Public Policy Priorities (<u>https://www.aauwmi.org/wp-content/uploads/2020/12/AAUW-Public-Policy-Priorities-2019-2021.pdf</u>) our organization supports "freedom from violence." Statistics below show that most Americans, including gun owners, support common sense controls.

Gun Violence: The Facts

 \cdot 9 out of 10 Americans agree that we should have universal background checks. In 2020, 45,222 people died from gun-related injuries in the U.S*

· 41k Americans die from Gun Violence every year- an average of more than 110 per day**

 \cdot Guns are the leading cause of death for children under 18^{***}

· 1,220 firearm deaths occurred in Michigan, 38% of deaths by homicide, 61% suicide****

Despite these grim and sobering statistics, meaningful gun violence prevention legislation continues to be thwarted by politicians influenced by powerful lobbies with deep pockets.




