AAUW Policy Resources

AAUW Action Network and Two-Minute Activist Tool: The cornerstone of AAUW's e-advocacy efforts:

Action Network sends subscribers urgent email notices when their advocacy is needed most. With Two-Minute Activist (twominuteactivist) online tool, it takes no time to contact your legislators and make your voice heard. Anyone with an email address can subscribe.

<u>AAUW Washington Update</u>: This weekly email bulletin offers an insider's view on the public policy process, the latest policy news, and updates from the Public Policy and Government Relations Department. Join the list (<u>aauw.us/washingtonupdate</u>) today.

<u>Quick Facts:</u> AAUW compiles current information and advocacy resources on issues related to our Public Policy Priorities in order to provide resources that offer rigorous analysis and most effective avenues for action. Michigan Women's Equality Day Celebration

AAUW Michigan hosted a most worthwhile luncheon meeting on Sat. Aug. 26. We were treated to three excellent speakers on the topic of the ERA. Well-known and respected AAUWMI member Laura Callow gave us an enlightening history and update of the ERA and AAUW. She was followed by the erudite Meghan Kissell, Senior Director of Policy and Membership Advocacy at AAUW, who brought us up to date the status of equal rights and the ERA. Although the ERA gained ratification of 30 states within one year of its Senate approval, mounting intense opposition from conservative religious and political organizations effectively brought ratification to a standstill. Keynote speaker, Representative Laurie Pohutsky (D-Livonia) urged us to watch the Michigan House Sessions and spoke about initiatives here in our state. Worthwhile!

I urge each one of you to put Aug. 24/24 on your calendars so you don't miss this event next year.

In October we will celebrate with our 2023 NCCWSL student delegates and hear their conference highlights. We will wear our own school spirit gear.


The November program, "Talking about Guns" will address this charged issue and how we talk with people about it. Your silent auction is during November's meeting. See detail on the front page of this newsletter.


