

This year is a big year for us as an organization as AAUWNN will be celebrating its 50tieth Anniversary. In the summer of 1975, as told by Nanci Olgren, there were seven articles printed in the Northville Record and Novi News calling all eligible women to organizational meetings for a new American Association of University Women (AAUW) branch to be established in Northville. On September 24, 1975, at the new home of Penny Nuechterlein, 55 women signed a 20" x 36" piece of parchment paper and became charter members of the Northville AAUW. Novi was officially added to the title in 1991.

We want you to help us celebrate! In lieu of a regular membership meeting the second Tuesday of September, we will be hosting 'A Walk Down Memory Lane: Fifty Years of Advocacy' on Wednesday, September 24 at Genetti's Hole-in-the-Wall. An official invitation is located elsewhere in this newsletter. We hope you will join us and bring a friend or family member to help us celebrate!

This fiscal year, July 2025 - June 2026 is a big fundraising year for us. SMALL PARTIES

Around 2016-18 we hosted a series of small parties to raise some extra money to help fund our philanthropic endeavors. So why now?

Since then, we have increased the number of high school scholarships we offer as well as the amount of each scholarship. We incurred a significant expense when we purchased the equipment for our zoom meeting availability. In the past most of our meetings were held in locations that did not

charge for the use of the meeting room; now, except for our lunch meetings, we must pay for the meeting room. Of course, prices have increased on everything else, too. As a result, for the 2026-27 year we are looking to recreate our small parties.

What are they? A series of parties, planned by our members, that may be hosted at a local venue or someone's home for free. We charge a fee to attend, maybe twenty-five dollars per event; and members and friends attend those of interest to them. We held a free event at a yoga studio, Cutco Knives hosts cooking classes for free, a wine tasting at someone's home, bourbon tasting, etc. Generally, fifteen to twenty members and friends would attend these small fundraisers.

What can you do to help? Right now, we are looking for ideas and people who might be willing to coordinate an event. Maybe you take an exercise class, and the instructor would be willing to host a session for free, or a yoga class, do you know a place that might host a wine tasting, how to write your family history or ??? The possibilities are endless. The plan is to run a series of these beginning the fall of 2026.

ty. I will collect these ideas and sometime in the spring we can start making plans and tying down dates and locations.
