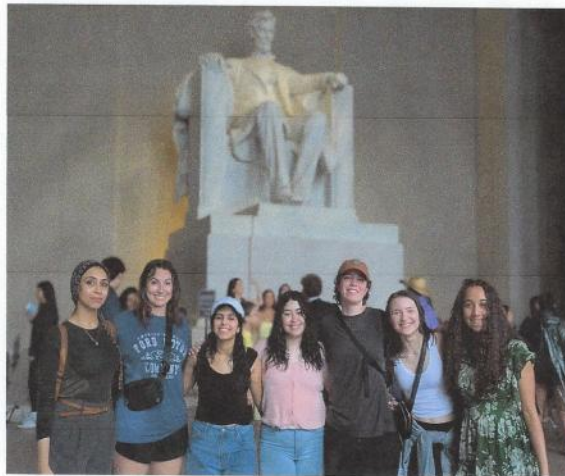

### AAUW Public Policy Principles & Priorities 2025-2027

Adopted May 2025

#### AAUW's Public Policy Principles

*AAUW's mission is to advance gender equity through research, education, and advocacy is grounded in these bold principles:*

**AAUW opposes all forms of discrimination** on the basis of age, disability, race, ethnicity, sex, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, geographic location, national origin, religious beliefs, pregnancy or parental status, or socioeconomic status, and supports constitutional protection for the civil rights of all individuals.

#### We Stand for Education

- **Higher Education:** Support affordable, inclusive higher education that yields high-quality credentials or degrees; reduces barriers to completion; and address the student debt burden, especially for women and borrowers of color.
- **Public Education:** Invest in strong public K-12 systems and oppose the use of public funds for non-public schools.
- **Inclusive Curriculum:** Ensure that curricula are accurate, science based, and free from censorship or bias.
- **STEM opportunities:** Close the gender gap in STEM and expand access to vocational and technical training.
- **Strengthened Civil Rights Protections:** Support safe, harassment-free learning environments by strengthening and enforcing protections to prohibit discrimination based on sex, race, and disability.

#### We Stand for Economic Security

- **Pay Equity:** Ensure equal pay for work of equal value through salary transparency, fair wage laws, and anti-discrimination enforcement.
- **Support for Caregivers:** Expand access to paid sick and family leave, and affordable child and elder care.
- **Retirement Security:** Protect and strengthen Social Security, Medicare, and Medicaid.
- **Reproductive Freedom:** Ensure access to contraception and abortion care.

#### We Stand for Social Justice and Civil Rights

- **Constitutional Rights:** Vigorously enforce civil rights, including recognition and publication of the Equal Rights Amendment, and improve disaggregated data collection.
- **Expanding Voting Rights:** Promote equitable political participation and ensure all Americans have full access and the right to vote.
- **Freedom from Harassment and Violence:** Guarantee protections from harassment and gender-based violence, and support efforts to combat human trafficking and reauthorize the Violence Against Women act.
- **International & Civil Rights:** Support U.S. advancement toward gender equity in education and the economy through the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action and ratification of CEDAW.

**AAUW's 2025-27 Federal Action Priorities**

To support equitable access to higher education-and to reduce the barriers that hinder women's advancement, especially women of color-AAUW advocates for:

- **Reinstating Title IX rules** that strengthen and clarify protections for student survivors of sexual harassment and assault, ensure accommodations for pregnant and parenting students, and affirm protections based on sexual orientation and gender identity.
- **Defending inclusive education** from attacks on diversity, equality, and inclusion.
- **Reducing barriers to postsecondary success**, including increased financial support and manageable student debt.
- **Addressing non-tuition barriers** such as paid leave, childcare, and access to contraception, and abortion care.

## 20 YEARS AGO IN 2005

### AAUWNN in 2005

As we approached our 30th birthday, Jane Connor Hale was our fifteenth president, assuming the office in 2024. She was followed by Joan Cotton in 2005 and Joyce Murdock in 2006 and then Joan and Joyce became co-presidents for 2007-2008.

During those years we were introduced to the Kids 4 Afghan Kids school program in Afghanistan by Khris Nedam. Khris was the founder and U.S. Director for this multi-ethnic and humanitarian non-profit school that we helped support.

Locally we learned about Schoolcraft College Empowering Women Program. In May 2005 we donated \$1500 to both Schoolcraft and Oakland Community College to help women achieve their education goals.

At the same time AAUW National released their study that showed women earned 80 cents for every dollar a man earned one year after college graduation. Ten years after college it was 69 cents.

### IN CELEBRATION OF THE 50<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF THE NORTHVILLE-NOVI AAUW

MRS. DINGELL: Mister Speaker, I rise today to recognize the American Association of University Women Northville-Novu (AAUWNN) on the 50th anniversary of its founding. The efforts its members have made to advocate for educational equity and empower women and girls are worthy of commendation.

The Northville-Novu Branch of the AAUW was established in 1975 to support the education and equal rights of women and girls in the area. For the first year, AAUWNN used the Northville High School cafeteria to host its meetings of about 65 members. Now, with over 100 members, AAUWNN is responsible for several community projects and programs including college scholarship funds and a career path day where middle school girls can learn about different career paths and hear from women business owners.

In addition, AAUWNN conducted a research project revealing a lack of books about women in the Northville and Novi school libraries. Due in no small part to AAUWNN's advocacy, the Northville and Novi libraries adopted the theme "Remember the Ladies." With funding from AAUWNN, books about women's history have been added to the Northville and Novi libraries, expanding the opportunity for women and girls in the area to read books about women's rights. The program has since expanded to the classroom where AAUWNN members read books from the "Remember the Ladies" collection to students in Northville and Novi schools during Women's History Month and National Reading Month. For their hard work and dedication, AAUWNN received the 21st Century Bridge Award from AAUW Michigan for the project.

The Northville-Novu Branch of the AAUW has proudly defended the education and rights of women and girls in a variety of ways. From hosting conferences centered around women's issues to partnering with local Northville-Novu organizations, the member's commitment to expanding opportunities for women and girls is evident and admirable.

Mister Speaker, I ask my colleagues to join me today in celebrating all of the progress that the Northville-Novu AAUW has made over the last 50 years. Because of their efforts, the world is a more equitable place for young girls and women. We thank them for all of their hard work, and we are excited to see the progress that is made over the next 50 years!

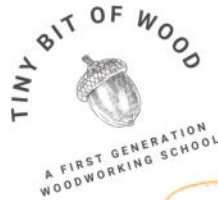
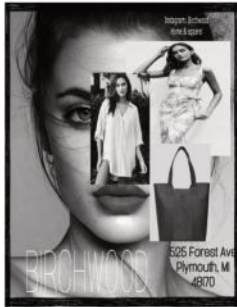
