The mission of AAUW is to advance gender equity for women and girls through research, education, and advocacy. And, since 1888, AAUW has been one of the largest funders of women's graduate education, investing in women who go on to change the world.

So, as an affiliate of AAUW, what have we been doing to advocate for women and girls and promote gender equity? First of all, let me say that without you, our members, nothing would happen and we would not exist as an organization.

With your help over the past year we have continued to support a variety of community based programs.

- **Remember the Ladies** supports elementary school libraries in Northville and Novi with materials about the contributions of women in history. Thank you Joyce Murdock!
- **Career Path Days (CPD)** for eighth grade girls provides an opportunity to explore Career Paths in science, technology, engineering and mathematics at Schoolcraft College and then meet women entrepreneurs in our local community. This year's CPD are coming up at the end of May. Thanks goes to Judy Sherman and her team of volunteers.
- We donate to the **Endowed Scholarship Programs** at both Schoolcraft College and Oakland Community College. We work collaboratively with the Livonia AAUW Affiliate and Schoolcraft College to send six women this year to the **National Conference for College Women Student Leaders** in College Park Maryland. Thank you goes to Ruth Rickard and Rhonda Donovan.
- We provide **two college scholarships** to deserving students from both Northville and Novi High Schools. Thank you goes to Caryn Doehler and her team of hardworking scholarship readers.
- In addition, we work to educate ourselves on issues and events by providing interesting and current guest speakers at our monthly membership meetings. Thanks goes to Mary Ann MacLaren and her Program Committee.

So how can we afford to do all of this, we have to raise money! This year we hosted two Mah Jongg tournaments (Thanks to Emily Doubler, Carol Murchison and Mary Ann MacLaren). Our big fundraiser, the Michigan Fashion Designer Showcase Luncheon, was held on April 25 thanks to the hard work of a whole crew of people. Finally, we took a payout from our endowment with the Community Foundation of SE Michigan and thanks to donations from our friends and members we have been able to increase the value of our endowment.

#### Your Voice Matters

We asked for your input in May's Newsletter. We want to share the survey results with you! 19 of our 70+ members responded. 84% of those who responded have been members for 5 or more years.

The average satisfaction rating is 3.8 out of a possible 5.

68% of the respondents prefer having a hybrid meeting available however, participation barriers appear to be primarily scheduling conflicts.

In terms of the preferred meeting time, you were evenly split on afternoon vs evening.

Your highest priorities for Program content:

Lifelong learning (educational speakers)	84%
Women's advocacy and public policy	68%
Local Interest topics (community, history)	53%
Social events and outings	47%
Health and wellness	42%

Comments included:

- Offer ZOOM Meeting recordings for a short time following the meeting
- Improve or standardize lunch options at meeting venues
- Attract and engage women across a broader range of ages and life stages
- Reintroduce potpourri activities and consider an annual membership retreat
- Mentor and involve new members in leadership from the start of their membership

## Our NEW Public Policy Advocacy Tool

### AAUWMI Action Alert: What it is & How to Use it

Resistbot is a simple, free tool that helps people contact their elected officials by sending a text message to 50409. It is an automated assistant that replies instantly with clear instructions when you text it. AAUWMI has chosen Resistbot as the platform for **AAUWMI Action Alert**, our new advocacy tool to alert our membership and public policy allies to take quick action on important pending legislation in the state of Michigan. Instead of searching for email addresses for your elected officials or writing your own message, you can sign an AAUWMI–drafted petition and send it to your representatives in under a minute!

#### How to SIGN UP for RESISTBOT:

1. Open your texting app.
2. In the “To” field, type: **50409**
3. In the message box, type **FOLLOW AAUWMI**
4. Press your phone’s **SEND** button.
5. You are now registered.

**Note:** The first time you use Resistbot in response to an Action Alert, you will be asked for your first name, last name, and zip code. You are asked for this information so the Bot can send your email message to the correct elected officials. You also will be asked for a title (e.g. Dr., Mr., Mrs., Ms.). It’s irritating to have to indicate your marital status, but email systems used by legislators require this information.

#### How to TAKE ACTION:

Now that you are registered for AAUWMI Action Alerts, you will receive text alerts about AAUWMI petitions on your phone’s texting app. Texts will come from the number **50409**.
